Mark your ballot with the Access Writer. . .

Feed printed ballot into the Vscan

**Access Station**

**Accessible voting booth to mark your ballot electronically, then print it out.**

Every polling place has an electronic ballot marking system, or Access Station, for voters with disabilities.

This allows voters who have difficulty marking a paper ballot with a pen to mark their ballot electronically. It is equipped with a touch screen, has larger print, an optional handheld controller with tactile switches and audio voting instructions, and can accommodate sip-and-puff devices.

Voter prints out their marked ballot then feeds it into a ballot scanner/ballot box (Vscan).
