## Where in the world is the ballot I requested?

The Hamilton County Board of Elections has been processing thousands of absentee ballot applications daily since the March 17<sup>th</sup> Primary Election was extended to April 28<sup>th</sup>. Beginning on March 30<sup>th</sup>, thousands of ballots have been mailed to county voters.

However, some absentee ballot request forms have been held up because the required information is not on the form. The most common error for this Primary Election is when a voter fails to indicate which ballot they want:

**Democratic/Issues or Republican/Issues or Libertarian/Issues or Issues Only**

**(A Primary Election is where parties nominate their candidates for the November 3<sup>rd</sup> General Election and you can only select one ballot style.)**

Please review the absentee ballot request form carefully when filling it out, so that it can be processed quickly. If you submitted a request form and have not received a ballot – What should you do?

For the extended March 17 Primary Election, voters have until noon on Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup> to deliver the request form, but are urged to get their request forms in as soon as possible. After receiving a request form, the board will mail a ballot to all eligible voters with a postage-paid return envelope.
